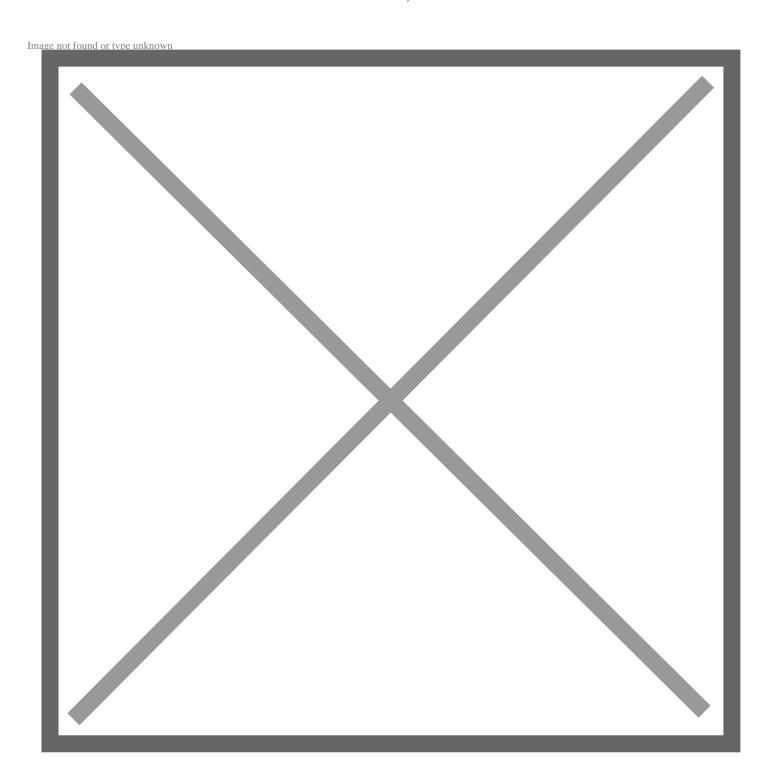
Buddy Kofoid Is Geared Up, Charged Up and Ready to Roll

While some young motorsports enthusiasts might idolize driver Buddy Kofoid, the Toyota Driver Development (TD2) racer wants them to know he's just like them.




