
What Toyota Driver Jade Avedisian Wants Her Fans to Know and Why Every Race Reveals a New Lesson

The Clovis, California native is taking her talents to late-model stock car and TA2 Series racing this season. She's amped and ready for this new adrenaline-inducing adventure.



So far, her practice is paying off. Avedisian kicked off the year at the World Series of Asphalt Stock Car Racing at New Smyrna Speedway, finishing fourth in the Pro Late Model standings with three top-five results.


She kept up the pace after the week-long event, adding two more Pro Late Model victories at Hickory and Coastal Plains Raceway.
