

Thousands Gear Up for Nationwide TogetherGreen Volunteer Days

Twenty-four participating Audubon sites nationwide will host *TogetherGreen* Volunteer Days in celebration of Earth Day to provide thousands with opportunities to take hands-on, local conservation action. Volunteer Days are a centerpiece of the *TogetherGreen* (<http://www.togethergreen.org/>) conservation alliance of Audubon and Toyota.

This series of days ? part of 240 taking place annually ? will occur in select cities across the country during the weekends of April 18th, April 25th and May 2nd, continuing the momentum of volunteer activity which started in September 2008. Activities include habitat and trail restoration, river and lake clean-ups, invasive species removal, nest-box building, wildlife and plant surveys, and more!
