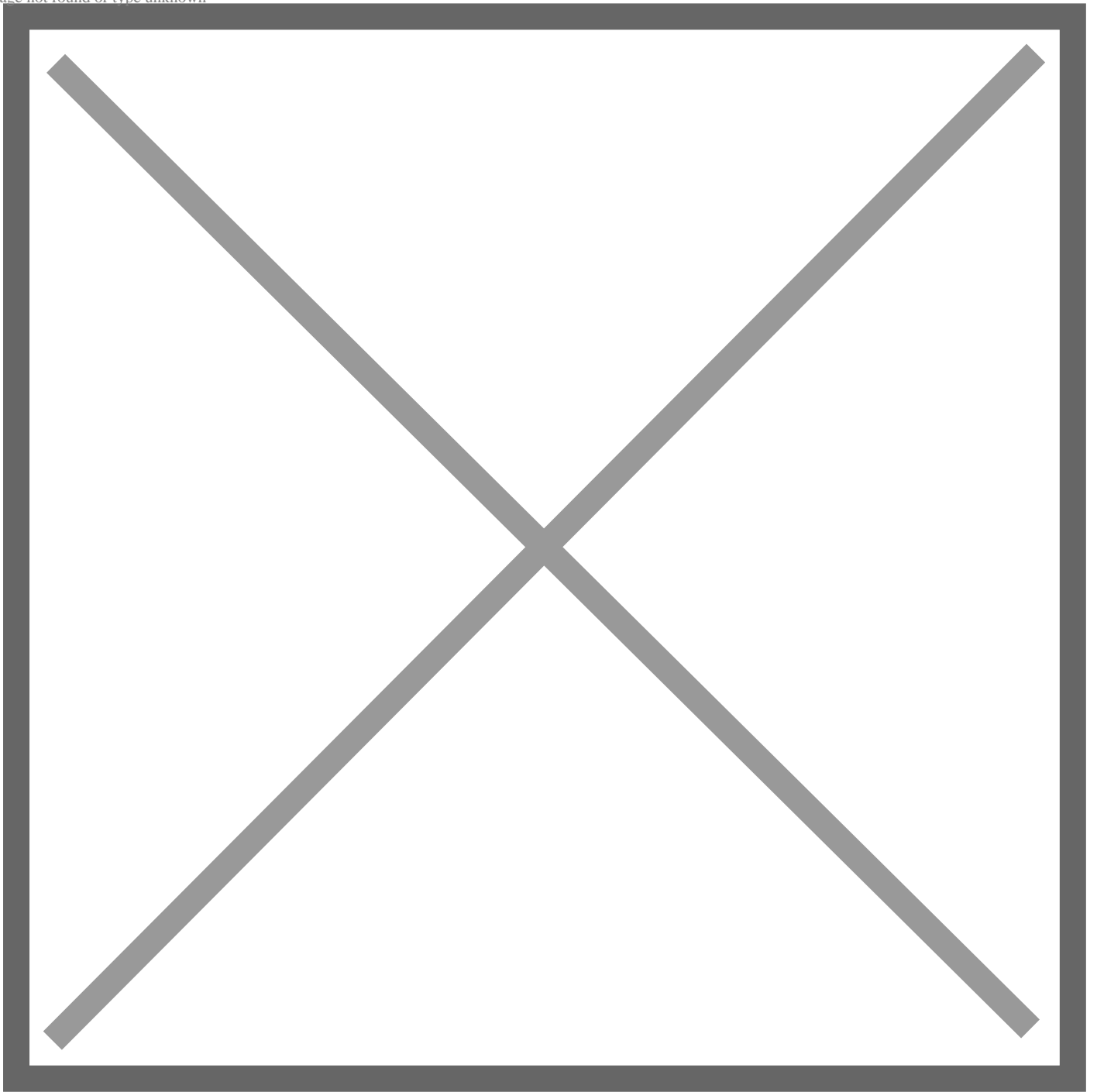
Series Camrys are the car to beat, as the team looks for its third straight checkered flag in Daytona Beach.
