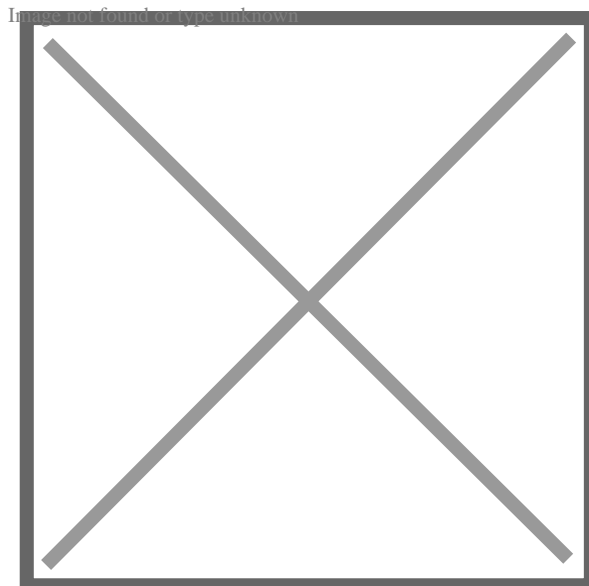


David Rosier
